- a. Bristol BID update next steps
- -Communications, projects and next steps in progress in preparation for November launch
- -New partnership approach with Council on operating agreement deliverables includes access to data, and finance.
- -Ballot review underway with feedback to BCC as 50% of ballots went outside of the city, rather than to local voter.

- a. Updates from Advisory Board members
- -June and July good visitors in hotels / lower year on year, and room rate lower
- -Restaurants are slower in warmer weather unless they have outside seating
- -Businesses being very cautious around new employment
- -Businesses exploring opportunities save staff costs and introduced new technology
- -Accountancy industry employing 30% less graduates this year due to AI
- -Third of businesses trying to recruit are finding it hard to find the suitable employment
- -Redundancy increasing across all industries.

- -Students; Higher Education sector in recession, significant redundancies across the country in education. Bristol not in that position yet but not recruiting. Unis so reliant on international students, but it's much harder to get visas now
- -Academic year has changed, which impacts length of stay in accommodation which has also become unaffordable.

- -Safe Space pilots. Well received. On hold until we can agree partnership project, support of partners.
