•	For year 2023/24, the income received was: £457,935, which includes a £10K voluntary contribution from Cabot Circus and £34,852 carried forward from the last BID.  Our anticipated expenditure is £416,286 with £41,649 carried forward to 2024/25.

<ul> <li>Vacant units and new openings</li> <li>■ There are currently 54 vacant units in Broadmead.</li> <li>■ New planned openings include:         <ul> <li>Gong Cha, a bubble tea store on Merchant Street to open on 10 July</li> <li>Charity Super.Mkt, moving from Cabot Circus to Penn Street</li> <li>Top Nails &amp; Model Eyebrows, moving from Cabot Circus to The Horsefair</li> <li>The Mayflower, a popular Chinese restaurant moving from The Haymarket to The Horsefair (opposite Primark)</li> <li>Greggs, large store and training centre to open on Broadmead West in September</li> <li>Shipleys Bingo, to open on Broadmead West</li> <li>Excelsior Comics! and Excelsior Games!, to move from two separate shops on Bond Street to the former BoConcept on Merchant Street</li> <li>Cuts N Fadez, a new barber to open in The Arcade</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Info
<ul> <li>Public realm and street management</li> <li>Bristol City Council have agreed to remove and replace some of the damaged bins.</li> <li>Bristol City Council no longer provides hanging baskets; the BID has sourced a new supplier and obtained a quote. A decision to order new hanging baskets needs to be made before February 2025. The cost would be approximately £3,500.</li> </ul>	Info

4. Marketing  An update was given on past, current and future marketing activity, including:  • Better Sundays markets – First Sunday / each month on Broadmead West, April to October  • Broad Meadow (24 May - 20 June) – Part of MayFest, an art installation 'bringing the meadow back to Broadmead' which included three days of free family activities. 11 planters have been retained, as well as benches and signage; the BID will arrange for a gardener to look after them and they will be watered by the cleansing team.  • International Cultural festival coinciding with Bristol Refugee Week (22 - 23 June) – The BID sponsored this event at Sparks, which saw traders and performers from over 30 countries participate. Almost 900 visitors were recorded, including the Lord Mayor.  • Sustainable Fashion Week (20 - 29 September)  • Cruises – The BID funded shuttle buses for two cruises at Royal Portbury to bring passengers directly to Bristol Shopping Quarter in May and June. The cruise operator paid for an additional two coaches to run to and from the ship all day. More dates are planned this summer.
